The Shelby County Commissioners met on Monday March 31, 2025, at 8:00 a.m., and present were Commissioners Abel, Lawson, Runnebohm, County Attorney and County Auditor.

MINUTES:

Motion to approve March 17, 2025, minutes was made by Runnebohm, seconded by Lawson, approved 2-0-1 (Abel).

Motion to approve March 24, 2025, minutes was Runnebohm, seconded by Abel, approved 2-0-1 (Lawson).

VEREGY:

Rick Anderson with Veregy wanted to check back with the Commissioners about doing an assessment on the buildings, to see where the county could save some money. Anderson advised he was here a couple months ago and was just following back. The Commissioner's advised that the county had done one about 10 years ago and they are still paying on it. And would like to visit this again after the Legislation is out and we see what kind of funding they are going to be cutting for the counties. This was information only; no action was required.

DOC GRANT APPLICATION APPROVAL:

Ben Taylor requested to set bid opening date for April 21, 2025, to accept and open bids for Bridges 146 & 128. Motion to approve was made by Lawson, seconded by Runnebohm, approved 3-0.

Refund – Motion to approve a refund in the amount of \$1,653.97 was made by Lawson, seconded by Runnebohm, approved 3-0.
