

The Shelby County Commissioners met on Monday, May 18, 2026, at 8:00 a.m., and the present were Commissioners Abel, Lawson, Runnebohm, John DePrez (Attorney) and County Auditor.

MINUTES:

Motion to approve May 11, 2026, minutes was made by Lawson, seconded by Runnebohm, approved 3-0.

SHELBY COUNTY FREIGHT RAIL SUPPORT LETTER:

At this time Commissioner Abel presented a letter of support for freight rail grants for the State of Indiana. Motion to approve was made by Lawson, seconded by Runnebohm, approved 3-0.

PLAN COMMISSION/ UPDATE TO THE COUNTY ADA TRANSITION PLAN:

Desiree presented the Commissioners with Resolution 2026-6 updating the County's ADA Transition Plan updating the ADA improvements that have been made to the County's Facilities.

Motion to approve Resolution 2026-6 was made by Lawson, seconded by Runnebohm, approved 3-0.

HUMAN RESOURCES/ EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK UPDATES:

Donna presented the Commissioners with three updates to the Employee Handbook.

1. Travel Policy – updated the meal reimbursement amounts.
2. Breavment Leave – 4.9 added a day for Niece or Nephew
3. Notifications – 6.2.1 added exempt and non-exempt employees.

Motion to approve was made by Lawson, seconded by Runnebohm, approved 3-0.

PSAP – DIGITAL VOICE LOGGING SYSTEM CONTRACT:

Tisha Debaun presented the Commissioners with the Digital Voice Loggin System contract with WSI. This is a 5-year contract with the option of one payment or payment of 5 years. Motion to approve the 5-year payment plan was made by Lawson, seconded by Runnebohm, approved 3-0.

COUNTY AUDITOR – RESOLUTION-NEED FOR PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING:

The County Auditor presented the Commissioners with Resolution 2026-7. This Resolution states the Commissioners are stating the County is in need of a Public Safety Building. Motion to approve Resolution 2026-7 was made by Lawson, seconded by Runnebohm, approved 3-0.

COUNTY SURVEYOR – CLENDENNING DRAIN:

Jeff Powell presented the Commissioner's with the findings for Phase II for the Clendenning Drain. Powell advised they went out and figured out there is about 2,815 feet of tile to complete the south side of State Road 44, they will need to put a new structure in. They will add another 3-year maintenance onto the tax rolls of \$40.00 per acre with a \$25.00 minimum and after that they will put a maintenance fee of \$5.00 per acre on. They have sent the bid advertisement to the paper, and it will be advertised two times and bidders may pick up the specs in the Surveyor's Office if interested. This was information only and no action was needed.

SHERIFF:

Sheriff Holder presented the Commissioners with the service agreement for the HVAC at the jail with Schneider. The total amount is \$15,918.00. This is up \$1,700.00 from last year. Motion to approve was made by Lawson, seconded by Runnebohm, approved 3-0.

HIGHWAY:

Taylor advised the structure down on 1100 S has been removed and they are setting the new structure today. If the weather holds off, they are still on track to open the road back up on Friday. This was information only; no action was needed.
